Speaking of Safety July 2019

Yes, safety is everyone's concern. Where do we all face major safety threats? In our car on the road. Oh no, a flat tire.

If your car is disabled on the side of the road, oncoming cars failing to see you is a concern for us all. A safety strobe light warning traffic to get over may save you and anyone with you. A detachable strobe device which operates on three triple A batteries can be seen up to 5,000 feet away. A magnet mount allows this warning device to be attached to your car to alert oncoming traffic of a stalled vehicle. You can order this device by going to the web site www.1tac.com.

Safety is a matter of attitude and that safety is up to each one of us every day. The problem comes when we let down our guard and become complacent in our routine activities. Anything we can do to help people make safe decisions in our daily routine will result in fewer accidents and lives saved. These roadside safety disks can act as reminders to us to be safe in our daily lives. I am suggesting that the Knights of Pythias promote the distribution of these safety disks in our lodges and in our communities. Saving just one life will make them all worthwhile. A cost of \$10 each is what it takes to order this device, but the possibility exists for ordering in bulk and saving by doing so. If we were to purchase a bulk order and make these disks available to our lodges we could impact many people and promote safety.

We here in Oregon are considering ordering a bulk amount and distributing them to our lodges, hoping that they will see their value and order more to make available in their communities.

"We are proud to sponsor this program and partner with Newton County schools to encourage young people to read and further their education," said Tim Loughmiller, a member of The Knights of Pythias.



The Domain of Oregon had a very successful Pythian Funday and campout at the Bandon/Port Orford Oregon KOA utilizing 48 camp sites for 150 campers! This year's event started Friday morning July 19, at Jerry's Rogue Jet Boats in Gold Beach Oregon, where we loaded up on 4 jetboats for a 52-mile trip up the Rogue River starting from the Pacific Ocean to the edge of the designated wild and scenic border. We had 121 Pythians and family members from 8 lodges riding in the high-powered jet boats.

The boat Captains were knowledgeable of the history of the river and shared with the riders many interesting facts of the local history along with a little folklore. We were treated to closeup views of wildlife; we had Bald Eagles and Ospreys flying overhead plus, many Deer along the river's edge. The riders in 2 of the boats were fortunate enough to spot a Bear! After 6 hours on the river 2 of the boats stopped at Whispering Ranch Lodge, and the other 2 stopped at Cougar Lane Ranch for a late buffet lunch.

The event on Saturday evening was a potluck dinner with the Grand Lodge providing the main course. We had over 150 people for dinner, there was so much food that no one left hungry. A great time was had by all, renewing old friendships from the different lodges, or catching up with old friends.
