

The Knights of Pythias was founded on February 19, 1864 in Washington D.C. the organization is based on the ancient Greek story of the famous friendship of Damon and Pythias and is the oldest fraternal organization chartered by an Act of Congress. The Order is non-sectarian and has as its main principles, Friendship, Charity and Benevolence. It has lodges throughout North America and in places around the world. The Order prides itself on promoting cooperation and friendship between people of good will, through service to our community and love of home and family.

Locally, Centre Lodge #3 is active in supporting Mary's Pantry in Raleigh through the collection and donations of non-perishable food items to help needy families, monetary donations to the Food Bank of Central and Eastern N.C; ongoing annual donations of children's bicycles at the Richard B. Harrison Community Library in support of the children's reading and literacy program. The lodge participated in the 2022 Memorial Day Services and wreath laying ceremony at the Raleigh National Cemetery and socially, an annual Holiday Year-end dinner and Installation of Officers event. 

# Monte Bello Lodge #10 Donates Book to the Florence Library in Memory of the Late Harry Williams

Late Brother John Henry "Harry" Williams of Florence, Alabama March 31, 1947-Januaey 3, 2023

On Thursday, March 16, 2023, officers and members from the Florence Knights of Pythias Monte Bello Lodge #10 and members of the John Henry "Harry" Williams family met with Jordan Collier, Assistant Local History and Genealogy Librarian for the Florence-Lauderdale Library, for the purpose of donating a book in memory of the late Brother Harry on behalf of the Williams' Family and the local lodge. Harry was a long-time resident of Lauderdale County and made many contributions to the community as a citizen, Chief Juvenile Probation Officer, president of the local Jaycees, a member of the Civitan Club, the local American Legion, and the Knights of Pythias. He graduated from Coffee High School in the mid-sixties and went onto attend Saint Bernard College in Cullman, Alabama, a private Catholic College and now a Prep School, where he received a Bachelor of Arts Degree. In addition to obtaining his BA degree, Harry later went to the University of Alabama, where he was a roommate with Former Lauderdale County Sheriff Rick Singleton, where they both obtained a master's degree.

After graduating from college, he worked for the Boys Scouts of American in the Huntsville-Decatur area. After leaving the Boy Scouts he became involved in the Juvenile Justice System in Alabama, first as a Juvenile Probation Officer in Morgan County, he then was involved with a Juvenile Detention Center in Muscle Shoals before becoming the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer in Lauderdale County, working in District Court Judge Leslie Johnson's Courtroom, another member of the local lodge. Harry also worked with former and late University of Alabama's Provost Dan Howard, another Lodge member, to develop a detention program for juvenile female offenders.

Before retiring from the state juvenile system, Harry returned to the District Court in Decatur, Morgan County as the Chief Juvenile Probation Officer. After retiring from the District Court Juvenile Probation Office in Decatur, he became a contract employee for the State of Alabama's Juvenile Justice System helping to set up offices across the state with advance technology. Harry was also instrumental with helping to develop laws related to the protection of children and juvenile delinquency.

Following his retirement Harry continued to invest and help his community by volunteering in organizations like the Knights of Pythias. At the time of his death in early January he had been working with Brother Leslie Johnson and other Brothers in the Lodge to develop a Divisionary Program for our youth that would assist children who have not been in trouble but without intervention might find themselves cross with the law. Harry was a very humble man and never sought recognition for himself or his accomplishments.



When a member of the local Florence Lodge passes away it is customary for the membership to donate a book to the Florence Lauderdale Public Library in memory of that member. Harry's family recommended that the Lodge donate "The Fight in the Clouds" by James P. Busha. The book is about pilots who flew the P-51Mustang during World War II. Harry's father, the late George Williams, another longtime resident of Florence, was a pilot in a P-51 Mustang during World War II.
