Speaking of 150th Anniversary pins, they are for sale at the cost of \$4.00 each – if you order a minimum of 100 pins at a time the shipping will be waived.





Members from Amethyst Lodge # 49, Welcome Temple # 7, Kathundra Temple # 25 and Nomads came together this evening for an evening of fun.


The cake was in celebration of the 150 years of Pythianism.







