The Knights of Pythias Medallion provides an excellent vehicle to honor someone and to announce that to the public, promoting the event and acknowledging and individual on behalf of our order and a lodge. Remember photos are invaluable aids and preserve the history. Plan events and recognition commemorating the 150th anniversary of the Order. Allow ample time for planning and promotion to give your ideas the time to be successful.

As the only fraternal order chartered by an act of congress, we can offer a continued feeling of belonging to a brotherhood founded on the principles of Friendship, Charity and Benevolence.

Since the federal government will not issue individual names of returning military personnel, we are requesting that if anyone has information about any returning military units in their domain, please forward that information to me so that I can contact them with our offer of membership.

These brothers and sisters have served us well and its time that we as members of the Pythian Order repay the debt.

As an additional thought and benefit, we would suggest to those lodges interested in this program that they consider free first years dues for all new military members.

Massachusetts


The Grand Lodge of Massachusetts has made the following donations:

HONOR LODGE PROGRAM
